I was a citizen of Madison Co <sup>Ark</sup>  
at the outbreak of the rebellion  
during the winter of 1862-3. I took  
refuge with the Federal forces  
at Fayetteville, and my two sons  
& son in law entered the Union  
Army (Co "C" 1<sup>st</sup> Arkansas Cavalry)  
and my family followed me some  
after. in the following April the  
1<sup>st</sup> Ark Cavalry evacuated Fayette  
ville & fell back to Cassville &  
Springfield Mo. the move was  
made in the night & without  
previous notice. I went with  
the command (feared to stay in  
land) but could not take my  
family: having no time to pre-  
pare. in a day or two my family
