TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

**KNOW YE**, that in consideration of military service performed by William Obanion to the State of North Carolina Warrant No 79 dated the 21<sup>st</sup> day of April 1784 and entered on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of November 1808 by No 945

THERE IS GRANTED BY THE SAID STATE OF TENNESSEE UNTO

William Todd assignee

of the said William Obanion

A CERTAIN TRACT OR PARCEL OF LAND, CONTAINING thirty acres part of said warrant by Survey bearing date the 17<sup>th</sup> day February 1809 lying in Rutledge County in the Second District on the western waters of the East fork of Stones river and bounded as follows to wit: Beginning at a white oak and back in the west boundary of Baldwin Heards 640 acre tract forty poles North from the South west corner running thence west twenty eight poles to an ash Sugar tree, thence North forty nine poles to two and white oak in said Heards line, thence with the same South to the Beginning

WITH THE HEREDITAMENTS AND APPURTENANCES, TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAID TRACT OR PARCEL OF LAND

WITH ITS APPURTENANCES TO THE SAID

HEIRS FOREVER. IN WITNESS WHEREOF
